Our major fundraising party this year will focus on celebrating the men and women who gave so much in the two World Wars to safeguard our rights and freedom. Now don't be thinking for a minute that this is a celebration of war and all the senseless and useless violence which brings nothing but death, grief and destruction. No way. Our party is a celebration of people, not war nor warmongers. This year our Fancy Dress fundraising party happens to fall during Remembrance Week; a time to remember, give thanks to and celebrate the men and women from all our families (as servicemen or civilians) who endured the atrocities of these wars and sacrificed so much so that we might have a better future.

So, we're looking forward to a party full of 'fancy' costumes depicting the times and the people of the two world wars. Come as a soldier, sailor, airman,

nurse, land girl, air raid warden, munitions worker, fire-fighter or engineer for example. Or why not dress up for a party the way our forbearers did when they went out partying during the Rag Time era of 1910 - 1920 or the Swing time of the 1940's. Why Your Support For Our Fundraising Is So Important

As you all know, for the last few years we're constantly being told times are hard and money is tight. Some 'bad' men took it and the rest of us have to pay for it.....right? Whatever the reason, we've all felt the impact of 'austerity'. The cuts in benefits and public spending are having a severe impact; particularly in communities like ours.

Last year over 550 men, women and children used our Centre well over 7,200 times between them. In each of the last three years the number of people using Kingsway's services and activities has gone up. This translates to an increase of 55% in numbers of people and an increase of 51% in numbers of visits in the last two years. Sadly, I don't think this remarkable increase in the numbers is wholly down to us getting better at doing what we do; to us at the Centre there is clear evidence of increasing numbers of people needing help in many different ways.



Over the same period we have experienced cuts in our grant funding and our income has reduced by about 42%. We can still cover the cost of our bills, keep our services and activities ticking over and keep the lights on. We are not raising funds to cover our costs. The amount of money raised is never more than 3 thousand; a small but very valuable amount for our work.

All funds raised are used to benefit residents and users of the Centre's programme. They help us pay for things like: workers for a few hours to organise games and refreshments for the kids during holidays; or help with outings for the Women's group and Mother & Toddlers group; hospitality at Christmas time; events in the Community Garden; etc. All the things that bring us together a bit more make us feel a bit better (at least for a while) and help in our children's development through fun and laughter.


